

LPGA VOLVIK CHAMPIONSHIP

Volunteer Committees

Admissions/Will Call: Members will be responsible for distributing pre-purchased tournament credentials and selling tickets on-site. Admissions members will also serve as greeters and assist in passing out tournament guides to all patrons. Minimum of three shifts of 4-5 hours each required.

Caddie Services: Members of this committee will be responsible for providing an enjoyable experience for all caddies. This will include assisting with caddie registration, bib distribution/pick-up, caddie dining, and maintaining the general caddie area. Minimum of three shifts of 4-5 hours each required.

Credential Control: Members will work in conjunction with the tournament's security team and ensure that event guests have the proper credentials to enter areas throughout the grounds. This includes assisting with all hospitality tents and providing customer service to our corporate hospitality guests. Minimum of three shifts required, where shift lengths vary.

Golf Channel: Responsibilities include working directly with the Golf Channel production crew in monitoring the leaders for television broadcast. Some members of this committee may be asked to participate as an extra walking scorer for marquee groups. Minimum of three shifts required, where one shift equals one day.

Guest Services: Members of this committee will be responsible for providing general knowledge to the tournament guests and answering patrons' questions about the event. Must be familiar with the tournament and Travis Pointe Country Club. Members are required to work a minimum of three shifts of 4-5 hours each.

Marshals: This is the largest committee and requires members to be standing or walking for long periods of time. Marshals are expected to assist with gallery control, golf ball spotting, and ensure that the player and fan experiences are not compromised due to lack of golf etiquette. Minimum of three shifts required, where shift lengths vary.

Media Services: These members will be responsible for assisting in the operations of the media center. This will include helping with media registration, ensuring that all interview processes are handled smoothly, and serve as a general help to the people working in the media center. Minimum of three shifts of 4-5 hours each required.

On-Course Services: This team will replenish water, ice, snacks, and other products as needed on the golf course. Please be aware that this position is physically demanding and requires heavy lifting. Minimum of three shifts required, where shift lengths vary.

Player Services: Participants will be responsible for player registration, preparation of player packets, and assisting with locker room duties. Members also need to be prepared to handle various requests from the players. Minimum of three shifts of 4-5 hours each required.

Practice Facility: Members are responsible for the upkeep of the driving range and practice putting green, which includes distributing range balls and organizing appropriate nameplates for each player. Minimum of three shifts required, where shift lengths vary.

Pro-Am/Special Events: Responsibilities for this committee include amateur registration, assembling and distributing gift packs, distributing prizes, and assisting with any other necessary duties before, during, and after the event. Must be available Monday-Wednesday of Tournament Week. Minimum of two shifts required, where one shift equals one day.

Scoreboards: Committee members will manage and operate all manual scoreboards and keep them up to date with the latest scores. Minimum of three shifts of 4-5 hours each required.

Scoring Central: This committee is essential for the scoring of the tournament with the use of radio communication and computers. Members will be responsible for monitoring the scoring computers and relaying incoming information from the Walking Scorers to the appropriate party. Minimum of three shifts required, where shift lengths vary.

Scoring Tents: Members will be responsible for tasks such as collecting and checking scorecards as the players finish and relaying the final scores to the rules office. Minimum of three shifts of 4-5 hours each required.

Shuttles and Carts: These members must be 21 years or older and knowledgeable of golf etiquette and the ability to operate a golf cart. They will be responsible for facilitating the distribution of golf carts to authorized Championship personnel, along with transporting players, caddies, volunteers, and staff to various locations. Members of this committee will also be responsible for assisting with the inclement weather evacuation process, if necessary. Minimum of three shifts required, where shift lengths vary.

Standard Bearers: The Standard Bearer committee will assign one volunteer to each group of golfers during the Championship Pro-Am and the four tournament rounds. Their job will be to carry a scoreboard ('standard') to inform spectators of the golfers' score in each group in relation to par for the Championship. This can be a physically demanding role as each volunteer will need to be able to walk 18 holes in various weather conditions and elevation changes while carrying the standard. This is an extremely high-profile volunteer position. Standard Bearers will be in the middle of the action and in a unique position to see the event from inside the ropes. Being a Standard Bearer is a very important part of the championship and there are some stringent procedures that have to be followed. Members must also have knowledge of golf etiquette and attend a mandatory training session. Minimum of three shifts required, where one shift equals 5-6 hours.

Transportation: Members of this committee will be responsible for providing the safe and efficient automobile transportation for players, their families, and VIP guests to and from the airport, hotels, and the Championship venue. Members will also be responsible for the organization and distribution of official tournament vehicles. You must be 25 years or older and possess a valid driver's license to join this committee. Minimum of three shifts required, where one shift equals 6-7 hours.

Volunteer Services: This committee is responsible for assisting the Tournament Team members by staffing the headquarters, handling uniform distribution, and helping coordinate the Appreciation Party. Among these duties, the Volunteer Services committee will act as a liaison and help with any special requests. Minimum of three shifts of 4-5 hours each required.

Walking Scorers: Walking Scorers will be required to walk all 18 holes with a group and mark each stroke, score, and statistic for each player in the group. The statistics will be kept on a wireless handheld palm device and scores will need to be reported at the end of each hole to Scoring Central. Walking Scorers will also need to keep the Standard Bearer in the group up to date about each player's scores. Members must have basic golf knowledge and be willing to participate in any type of weather condition. Minimum of three shifts required, where shift lengths vary.
